# ABOUT MALAWI

Malawi still remains one of the poorest countries, ranking 173<sup>rd</sup> out of 182 countries

- 80% living in rural areas and relying on small scale household farming
- 75% of Malawians live on less than £1 per day
- Only 9% of the population have electricity
- 1 in 5 children die before the age of 5
- 1 in 7 women die at child birth
- Over 1 million orphans
- Malawi has the 2nd fastest growing population in the world, currently around 18.5 million
- 95% of the population are young or elderly dependents, and the average age is 16yrs old
- 1 in 3 don't have access to clean water



During the year MRF continued to improve access to clean water and sanitation providing water and saving lives.

Over 2.4 million people in rural areas do not have access to clean and safe water.

Many travel 30 minutes daily to nearest water point. Otherwise they have to survive on unclean water.

Diarrhoeal diseases are the second biggest killer of children under 5 in Malawi and approximately 30,000 people die every year linked to dirty water, namely diarrhoea, dysentery.

# Restoring vision for a better life

MRF is committed to improving access to healthcare.

Malawi has one of the highest levels of preventable blindness with over 160,000 people having low vision due to cataracts.

Access to this, simple low-cost, and life changing surgery is often unaffordable and out of reach for many Malawians.

This has been a fantastic year delivering almost 7,300 operations.

The Gift of Sight programme targets people in rural areas where there are no hospitals providing cataract operations free of cost.

# Access to Health Care and **Treatment Clinic and Maternity Unit**

Primary Health care in Malawi is free for all at the point of delivery. However there is an acute shortage of practitioners, doctors and resources to meet the country's needs.

MRF are providing bursaries to 52 students at various universities to help build the capacity in the health sector

Access to health care is also a key issue. MRF provides bursaries to help with complex health care treatment.

Maternal mortality and neonatal mortality in Malawi are still among the highest in Africa and in the world.

We have drawn up plans for our new health centre to include a health clinic, a maternity clinic, as well as dentistry and optometry unit.

It is anticipated this will significantly improve access to primary health care antenatal, perinatal and postnatal care, and offer much needed additional support for pregnant women at risk to reduce mortality rates and death rates amongst mothers giving birth.

# Making Health-care Accessible

The remote areas have perennial problems of impassable muddy roads and difficult terrain that is inaccessible by motor vehicle. Many clinics are 5 to 20 KM away.

This makes it challenging to transport the sick, elderly, children and expecting mothers as the hospitals / clinics. Most have to walk and many are unable to make the journey and unfortunately, lose their lives

The rural bicycle ambulance is a low cost solution to access healthcare that can help save a life.

# Improving Mobility, For People With Disability

The aim of the project is to alleviate poverty and improve the life of those suffering from immobility due to their disability.

#### The tricycles allows:

- Children to attend school,
- Adults to go to work or complete their studies
- Promotes independance
- Improve their self-esteem and confidence

# Keeping People Warm and Safe In Winter

A majority of the people living in rural areas live in poor housing and have little protection against the elements. Most can't afford to keep warm in the winter months and a blanket is a luxury they can only dream off.

The winter warmth programme also provides blankets to some hospitals to help look after the sick.



This year MRF provided 10,000 blankets Cost £5





# Transforming Lives through Graduate Scholarships

At less than one percent, Malawi's tertiary education enrolment rate is among the lowest in the world which has a direct impact on the development of the country.

MRF's TALHA Scholarship Fund provided scholarships to 226 students on a range of degree programmes in the various universities.

The beneficiaries have also signed up to volunteer programme during the holiday period to help make a difference to the poor and needy.

Once graduated the beneficiaries will be able to secure high grade jobs and sustain their families. It will improve their quality of life.

# Pushing Improvement In Education Attainment

Primary Education is free in Malawi; however, there is an acute shortage of primary school teachers, classrooms and resources.

Working in partnership with Maryam Girls Teacher Training College we have, for very many years, sponsored 100 students every year on this two year programme. Most of the students are from poor backgrounds who would otherwise struggle to afford the fees and complete their studies.

Once they qualify as teachers, all of them secure meaningful employment as primary School Teachers in government schools.

# Give Children the Good Start They Deserve

All children deserve a good start to ensure they can fulfil their potential.

Having piloted the nursery programme this year we are set a vision to start 20 new nurseries which will provide a good quality education. Our aim is to prepare the children for primary school as well as support their intellectual, emotional and spiritual development.

# Creating Brighter Futures for Secondary School Students

The costs of secondary school fees exclude all but the wealthiest Malawians from secondary Education. This has a significant impact on the economy and life choices of very many young people.

Our school scholarship programme covers the cost of secondary school fees, textbooks, uniforms, and transportation and where required, boarding costs. Our programme will help 300 children in secondary education.






# **Creating Brighter Futures**

MRF have supported the development of a Learning Block, Admin Block and Library at Al-Mahmood.

The development provides first class learning space for students as well as the First Islamic Library in the Country providing much needed resource and referencing material.







# Equipping Students With Construction Skills Ready For Employment

The Vocational Training Centre offers students apprenticeship in key construction skills, carpentry, joinery, bricklaying and plumbing. The students are also provided placement opportunities in industry

The objective of this programme is to:

- Equip young men and women with the technical and vocational skills and knowledge to promote self-reliance and break the cycle of poverty and
- To improve their chances of securing employment or start their own small-scale business.

# **Empowering Women**

The Women development programmes supports women, mainly widows, to develop tailoring skills, and receive basic education including child care and social life skills.

The aim is to help equip them with the skills to be able to generate an income and sustain their families.

The tailoring programme is delivered in a number of centres in remote areas to make it accessible.

On completion of the programme, all participants receive a sewing machine and starter kit which allows them to return home and earn a livelihood or secure employment in local nurseries.

# Workings towards food security.

Small household farmers are provided with fertilizers and in some cases also seeds to encourage them to harvest crop, which ensures a sustainable food supply for the year thereby reducing their reliance on aid.

### Winter Cropping:

Our Building Resilience Programme aims to encourage small household farmers to change their farming patterns and, where possible, plant an additional winter crop to promote and stimulate self-sufficiency and supplement the main harvest.

# **Enabling Economic Empowerment**

### **Improving Life Chances For Orphans**

Shukran Orphanage is our flagship project where we provide a caring and supporting living environment for 60 children. The children are provided with secular and religious education and support with their physical, social, emotional and spiritual development.

This year we have started a primary school at the complex to ensure the children receive the best standard of education.

Our aim is to ensure each child is inspired and supported to fulfil their full potential.

- Malawi has over 1 Million Orphans.
- Only 6% of Orphans receive any medical support;
- 7 out of 10 child deaths are due to preventable causes such as malaria, diarrhoea, pneumonia, malnutrition:
- 1 in 3 orphans fail to start even primary education, which is free in Malawi.




# Improving Living Conditions By Building Decent Homes

Almost 82 % of the population live in rural areas, Most of people continue to live in sub-standard mud houses, many without protection against the elements.

Over 80% of the population don't have access to WC's. Our shelter programme will also aim to provide WC's and washrooms

Our ambitious plan is to build 2,000 decent homes over the next few years to improve the living conditions, improve sanitation and access to clean water.



We have built over 1,200 new homes.

Cost: £900 per house £200 for washroom and WC





# **Developing Communities**

Most communities in Rural areas are isolated from support services. Our concept of developing a community complex comprising of a Masjid, a learning block which is used for madrassah, adult learning, women development programmes, and a nursery to serve the local community creates a local hub for community engagement and development

We also provide a borehole which provides access to clean water for the local community in the surrounding villages.

The complexes are used to support our humanitarian aid including distribution of food, farmers packs as well as community and training programmes. This ensures the centres are well used.

# **Developing Communities**

Our programme to provide mussalahs for the rural masjids using PVC cushioned mats which will ensure that the community will have a clean and appropriate place of worship.

# Tackling Hunger Feeding The Poor

Iftar Packs: As part of our programmes to address food insecurity, the Iftar food packs provide families with much needed food during this blessed month.

Masjid Iftaris: provide cooked meals prepared by the locals at the masjid for a collective Iftari for on Average 40 – 50 people

This is a great program which encourages the local people from the villages to participate in the preparation of the meals and to join in the collective festive meal at Iftari time.



We provided food packs to 58,000 families (equating to 4.6 million meals) and provided 140,000 cooked meals




# Tackling Hunger Feeding The Poor

# Supporting the poor and Vulnerable

The objective of our Direct Support Programme (DSP) is to reduce poverty and hunger among ultra-poor households living in some of the remotest villages.

The programme forms part of our social protection strategy which also includes support for the beneficiaries through other interventions such farming input subsidy, education support, etc.

The householders are provided with a pack every month including food and daily essentials and at times money.
